When creating this industrialized landscape look, I wanted to feature the elements I love seeing on my daily (okay...weekly) walks, such as textured foliages, dainty blooms, and natural elements such as birch bark and woodsy components. I chose rose gold to gild my leather leaf fern because it pairs well with the deep plum of the carnations and the fuchsia of the waxflower, although gold or copper would be charming too!

## Introduce multi-level fillers!

Infuse your design with filler blooms that emulate nature. Feverfew, solidago, waxflower are just a few options. Mix it up!

### Texture, texture, TEXTURE!

Mix in medium-large textures such as button poms, daisies, or even thistle.

#### Create visual depth!

Deep-toned carnations in this design establish depth to draw the eye inward.

#### Final touches!

Use green trick dianthus, fuji mums, roses, or even lilies to create the "wow" factor!

#### Choose a container!

Natural containers such as birch wrapped vases, wood boxes or even a clear cylinder wrapped with Birch Aspedicore ribbon would also be great options.
